Course summary/aims:	
Course objectives:	<p>1. Students will learn the structure and the pronunciation of the Italian alphabet and will be able to spell out their names in the target language. Students will be able differentiate between formal and informal usage of the Italian language</p> <p>2. Students can meet and greet in the target language, saying hello and goodbye, yes and thank you and different forms of address. Students are able to ask What is your name, using the appropriate form of the verb</p> <p>3. Students can ask “How are You?” and respond appropriately in the target language and differentiate between formal and informal usage. Students will learn the endings of the verb stare</p> <p>4. Students can start introductory conversations - to ask how others are doing - to say how they are doing. Students will learn how to use masculine and feminine pronouns</p> <p>5. Consolidation of the vocabulary covered from the previous sessions and take part in a short role play Students will learn the endings of the two auxiliary verbs essere and avere</p>
Course content:	This beginners course will enable you to introduce yourself, start a basic conversation, understand the masculine and feminine pronouns and learn the Italian alphabet.
Teaching and learning methods:	This will be delivered in a classroom setting with tutor led activities, worksheets and role play.
