Course: Local History: Lincolnshire Heritage sites	Awarding body: N/A
Tutor: Loretta Rivett	Course length: 5 weeks

Course summary/aims:	The purpose of the course is to help participants decide why a site might be identified as part of Lincolnshire's heritage and discover some of those found throughout the county.
Course objectives:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. List 10 popular Lincolnshire heritage sites 2. Discuss at least one heritage site with fellow students 3. Identify at least 6 religious heritage sites in Lincolnshire 4. Compare two Lincolnshire dwellings from different historical periods 5. Identify at least two sites that are not buildings and state where they are and what makes them a heritage site
Course content:	A meander through Lincolnshire pausing along the way at various heritage sites. We may look at the sites of Thornton Abbey, Tattershall castle, Crowland Bridge, Doddington Hall and other places at student's request.
Teaching and learning methods:	Tutor input, group discussion and individual research.
Course level/entry requirements:	Previous knowledge or skill is not required so long as you have a keen interest in Lincolnshire and its historical sites, and learning more about them
How progress is checked during course:	Participation in discussion groups. Question and answer. Presentation of own research.
Extra study or practice required at home?	Some further research, practice or coursework may be carried out each week.

Materials you will need to bring to the course:	Paper pens, and drawing materials.
