At this stage, it would also be helpful to discuss any learning needs you may have.

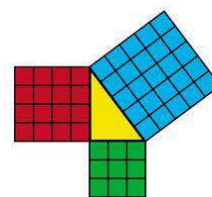
# Support Fund

We have a small Support Fund if the costs of learning are a barrier. This can be used for course materials, transport or child care. Please request a Support Fund Application Form if you wish to apply.



# Maths Programmes

We offer GCSE Mathematics and other pre-GCSE courses at a range of levels from Entry to Level 2. Come and complete an initial assessment to find the right course for you.



## Maths – Functional Skills Level 1/2 (OCR)

Functional Maths helps you to develop a wide range of maths skills including number, decimals, fractions, measurement, area, volume and data collection/statistics. The course emphasises the application of maths to everyday and work situations. Helps progression to GCSE.

**Day:** Wednesday

**Time:** 1300-1500

**Start date:** 20.01.16

**Duration:** 16 weeks

**Fees:** Free for anyone without GCSE Grade A\*-C in Mathematics

### Levels:

Maths and English courses can be available at 6 levels: Entry 1 → Entry 2 → Entry 3 → Level 1 → Level 2 → GCSE Grade A\*-C. Normally you should follow a course that is one level above your initial assessment (ask for more information).

# Vocational Programmes

These courses lead to recognised qualifications and are designed mainly for people wishing to progress to further learning, work or self-employment. They are also useful for people hoping to progress to Access to HE.



## Sector Based Work Academy – Get into Hospitality and Customer Service

Put yourself at an advantage when applying for jobs locally in hospitality or customer service roles. The programme includes a workplace visit and a food safety certificate. *Tutors: James Parsons and Barbara Hancock*

## Community Learning

These **non-accredited** courses and workshops are designed for interest, personal development and community involvement. People who have not been in learning for a while are particularly welcome.



### Art for Relaxation

"Art washes away from the soul the dust of everyday life" (Pablo Picasso). If you're feeling stressed or unhappy, why not come along to these sessions and explore painting and craft activities designed to promote relaxation and focus on the positive and good. ### Community Gardening in Spring

### Computing for the Terrified

### Craft from Natural and Recycled Materials

### Employability for Hospitality

This course will accompany the Hospitality Skills course but can be undertaken separately. You will be supported in developing/updating your CV so that it is targeted towards hospitality and related jobs, writing a relevant cover letter, applying for jobs online and practising your interview skills. *Tutor: James Parsons/Nicola Gadd*

### Food Safety (CIEH Level 2)

This essential course covers the causes of food poisoning, contamination, high risk foods and much more to help you to adopt safe working practices in the handling of food in work or community settings. *Tutor: Trevor Cutmore*

### Introduction to iPads and iPhones

This course is suitable for those wanting to start a career in Office Administration. Understand key tasks and the functions of a busy office and learn practical skills such as filing, photocopying, business letters and creating a "To Do" list. *Tutor: Nicola Gadd*

### Introduction to Psychology

## Painting in Acrylics

You will explore the use of acrylic techniques, including how to use them in various ways (washes, palette knife and brush). You will learn about using acrylics in conjunction with other materials such as pencil, incorporating collage and working into the surface to create textures. *Tutor: Alan Lowes*

## Understanding Dementia

The statistics on dementia are powerful: currently in the UK, there are approx. 850,000 people with the disease and 2/3 of sufferers are women. Many families are now affected by a member having the condition and it's not always well-understood. This one-day course will explain what dementia actually is, the different types and possible treatments or support available – both now and hopefully in the future. *Tutor: Ray Mason*

## Mablethorpe

Flare and Bridge 2-2 are flexible study programmes for young people aged 16-18 to help you to progress to college, apprenticeships or employment.

You can gain qualifications from entry level to level 2. Flare is designed for those working towards level 1 qualifications that need extra help to build confidence and skills. Bridge 2-2 is for those students who are working towards level 2 qualifications and are focused upon gaining the skills needed for the working world.



Flare and Bridge 2-2 provide a practical study programme built around your needs. You can study a range of varied vocational subjects alongside English and maths.

## Fees

All courses are subsidised but concessions are available in certain cases.

### English and Maths

- Free to anyone who hasn't achieved GCSE Grade A\*-C in the subject. This applies to all English and Maths courses including GCSE.

### Vocational Courses (Accredited)

- Concessionary fee if you work less than 16 hours per week AND you receive a state benefit (excluding state retirement pension) AND you sign to say that you are doing the course to develop skills for future employment
- Free if referred to the course by Jobcentre Plus and on JSA or ESA (WRAG).

### Community Learning (Non-Accredited)

- There is a reduced fee for people aged 65 years+
- There is a further reduced fee for anyone on a state benefit (excluding state retirement benefit).

### Learning Minds Courses

- Designated Learning Minds courses are free for people who have had or are currently experiencing mental health problems.

### Additional notes

- Occasionally, we run courses which have no subsidy. In these cases, they are only available by paying the full fee
- All the courses in this brochure are funded for learners aged 19 years and over on 31 August 2015 (except the Flare course).
- There is a small Learning Support Fund for people who find it difficult to pay for the costs of learning e.g. travel, materials.

CLIP offers accredited and non-accredited courses for local people in Gainsborough, Market Rasen and Mablethorpe and sometimes further afield. Our aim is to widen participation in learning by people in rural, coastal and other local communities. We offer programmes for 16-18s (Flare) and adult learners of all ages. We also run the Learning Minds project for people who have experienced mental health problems.
